Pupils **ages 5-11** can access lots of information, videos and resources on the Torah, Festivals such as Shabbat, Rosh Hashanah and Hanukah and other aspects of Jewish life like the Shema prayer found in a Mezuzah.

Older pupils aged **11-14** can find information, videos, podcasts, and resources about Jewish belief, practices and lifestyle including laying Tefillin and using the Mikveh. Students can gain valuable insight into differences between the streams of Judaism from an Orthodox and Liberal Rabbi. The Jewish Museum also have resources to support Holocaust education accessed via their Learning Portal.
