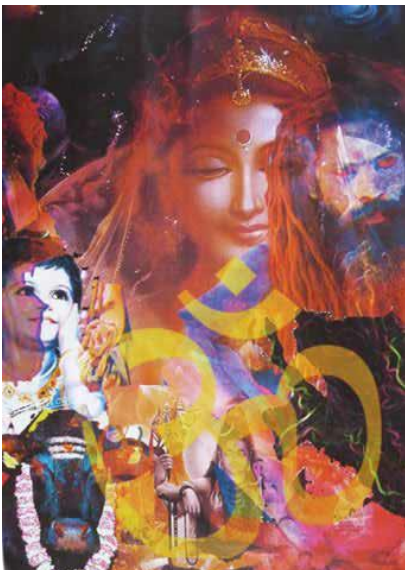

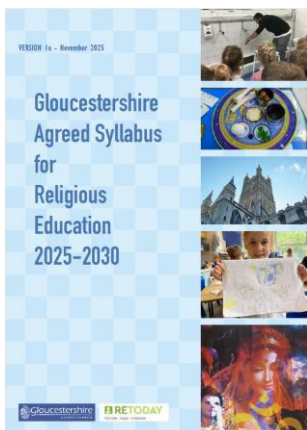
A conference for teachers of RE from primary schools, including subject leaders and head teachers.
